GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE

The Department of Agriculture and Rural Development in accordance with the terms of the above legislation hereby authorises the importation into Northern Ireland of: -

**PRODUCTS LISTED IN THE ATTACHED
SCHEDULE FROM GREAT BRITAIN**

Subject to the following conditions:

Products listed in Schedule 1.

1. Any product landed in Northern Ireland under this licence shall be made available for inspection if so required by an Officer of the Department.
2. The importer or his agent shall afford all assistance necessary to such an officer to enable him to carry out the inspection.

Products listed in Schedule 2

1. In addition to the above conditions, each product must be accompanied by a **commercial document** containing the following information
 - I. the name and address of the consignor and consignee;
 - II. the date of issue of the document and a number enabling it to be identified;
 - III. the description of the product to be transported;
 - IV. the total quantity dispatched.

2. Imports of meat (fresh, red meat and farmed game) and meat products derived from cattle, sheep, pigs, goats and other biungulates must comply with the requirements of the Food Hygiene Regulations (NI) 2006.
3. Imports of raw material for pet food manufacture must comply with either the Animal By-Products Order (Northern Ireland) 2002 in the case of low risk animal by product or with the Food Hygiene Regulations (NI) 2006 in the case of meat fit for human consumption.

This licence is valid until further notice or unless revoked by the Department.

NOTES

1. Products landed in Northern Ireland which are destined for onward intracommunity trade, must be accompanied by documentation in accordance with the relevant European Community legislation.
2. Products imported into Northern Ireland destined for export to a Third Country must be accompanied by documentation which meet the requirements of the Third Country.
3. Any breach of any condition attached to this licence will constitute an offence against the Diseases of Animals (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 (as amended).
4. Nothing in this licence gives exemption from any prohibition or restriction imposed by the Food Hygiene Regulations (NI) 2006, the Veterinary Medicines Regulations 2006 and the Medicines Acts 1968 and 1971 or by any legislation superseding or amending the same.

SCHEDULE 1

Animal hair and bristles of non FMD susceptible species

Any product derived from canines, felines, rats, mice, guinea pigs, hamsters, gerbils, hares and rabbits (excluding meat and offal)

Any product derived from horse, ass, mule, hinney or zebra (excluding semen and fresh meat/offal)

Any product derived from mole, mink, weasel, vole, stonemartin or squirrel.

Bone Ash

Bone charcoal.

Bone phosphates.

Dried animal tissue and liquid animal tissue extracts of non FMD susceptible species.

Ivory.

Leather.

Manufactured bone or horn articles.

Manufactured bone or horn articles.

Manufactured leather articles.

Manufactured glues.

Oil and waxes of animal origin.
