



Cliftonville Stream Drainage Scheme, Belfast

Notice of Proposed Drainage Scheme Not Likely to have Significant Effects on the Environment

The Department of Agriculture and Rural Development hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Article 12A (3) of the Drainage (Northern Ireland) Order 1973 (as amended) that it proposes to carry out a drainage scheme.

The proposed scheme relates to a 178m length of the Cliftonville Stream which flows in a southerly direction from the junction of Oldpark Road and Alliance Avenue to Deerpark Grove.

The scheme will comprise of culverting the open channel with 48m of 1200mm dia pipeline with associated manholes and an inlet structure. Regrading and raising of flood banks along 35m open channel, and minor localised regrading to a further 95m of open channel.

Having taken account of the characteristics of the works in the proposed scheme, their location and potential impacts, the Department considers the proposed scheme is not likely to have significant environmental effects on the environment and does not intend to prepare an Environmental Statement.

A copy of the proposed scheme and details of the estimated environmental effects will be available for inspection at the address given below for a period of 28 days between the hours of 9.00 am – 5.00 pm or at Belfast City Council.

Any person who considers that his interests will be prejudicially affected by the proposed scheme may make representations to the Department at the address given below.

In accordance with Article 12A (3) representations may also be made in writing to the Department in relation to the likely environmental effects of the proposed scheme
